



Exclusion Periods

| Medication / Ailment | Exclusion Period |
|---------------------------------------|--|
| Chicken Pox | 120 hours or until spots have dried, whichever is longer |
| Covid-19 | 72 hours from the point of diagnosis |
| Diarrhoea | 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea |
| Hand, Foot & Mouth | 120 hours or until spots have dried, whichever is longer |
| Headlice | Once free of all headlice and eggs |
| Paracetamol (e.g., Calpol) | For the remainder of the nursery day in which a dose is administered |
| Temperature more than or equal to 38° | For the remainder of the nursery day in which the high temperature is recorded |
| Vomiting | 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting |
| Other | Please enquire for guidance |

HOW IT WORKS

- We base our exclusion periods on governmental guidelines which can be found on the gov.uk website.
- We may apply more stringent exclusion periods, regardless of the guidelines, if we feel the risk to the other children, staff or families is significant.
- The exclusion period starts from the last time medication was taken or an ailment occurred..
